City's homeless to be remembered

Our Lady of Lourdes Health System will host a candlelight vigil tonight to remember the homeless who have died this year.

The vigil, scheduled for 5 p.m. at the Bergen Lanning Health Center on Clinton Street, is being held today because it is the official onset of winter, the toughest time of year for the homeless.

The center is home to Project H.O.P.E., which stands for Homeless Outreach Program Enrichment.

The project is the only provider of medical services to the homeless in Camden County, according to hospital officials.

Through the center and its mobile health unit, Project H.O.P.E. provides medical, social, outreach and advocacy services to nearly 1,500 homeless a year in Camden.
